WHAT DOES EXPANDING HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES MEAN?

Several studies have shown that where a person lives is a more likely indicator of their success in life than anything else.¹ This means that your "zip code is more likely to predict [your] levels of educational achievement, financial success or failure, whether or not [you are] likely to develop diabetes or high blood pressure, and even how long [you] can expect to live."²

Where you live matters! For example, life expectancy in the poorest zip code in New Orleans is 25.5 years lower than life expectancy in the city's richest zip code.³

The Housing Choice Voucher Program is designed to be more than just rental assistance. The voucher is also a means to break out of the cycle of poverty by enabling families to live in neighborhoods of opportunity for gainful employment, quality education, reliable

transportation, racial and ethnic integration, and higher quality housing with less crime.⁴

There are many combined factors that help ensure an individual's success. It can be difficult to define the characteristics of a neighborhood of opportunity. One of these factors appears to be the low concentration of poverty.⁵ Go to

Studies show that for "every extra year a child spends growing up in an area with better outcomes on the Opportunity Altas causes the child to have better outcomes in adulthood."
